Case progression – at a glance


- We have received 15 new concerns during the reporting period, a decrease from the previous quarter (21).
- The IC met remotely on three occasions, which also included a meeting to provide comment on a rule 19 application to discontinue a case referred to the PCC.
- During this reporting period the PCC met on two occasions, considering one PCC review case and a case management hearing.
- The number of cases awaiting PCC consideration has increased by one case to 13 cases.





Professional Conduct Committee

- During the reporting period the PCC held one PCC Review hearing.
- The PCC also held one Case Management Hearing, imposing directions to assist in the progression of the case.
- The lower than usual output of hearings at this stage is for three principal reasons:
 - Currently 45% of our caseload is made up of third-party cases (police/courts/health) awaiting conclusion before we can progress;
 - Two hearings were postponed this quarter. In one case we received new evidence shortly before the commencement of the hearing which meant the hearing had to be postponed. Another hearing was postponed due to the health of the registrant;

- The low number of concerns we have received between Q3 2021-2022 and Q2 2022-2023 has had some impact on the number of total referrals to final hearing.
- There are currently 13 cases at the PCC stage, the breakdown of which as follows:
 - Two were scheduled for a hearing however were postponed for the reasons provided above. We are actively working to progress and/or reschedule these cases at the earliest opportunity.
 - In four cases the court has only recently concluded the Registrant's trial and sentencing.
 - In two other cases we await a potential referral by the IC to the PCC to 'join' with allegations already referred to hearing.
 - In one case we had progressed the matter via the Rule 19 (discontinuance of hearing). However, the PCC chair determined that a hearing should take place. We are in the process of preparing this case for hearing.
 - One case is currently with the police and we await the conclusion of this investigation before we can proceed any further.
 - In two cases we are preparing the service of the case in accordance with our standard case directions. We can then proceed to schedule them for hearing.
 - In another case we have served this on the registrant however, due to the complexity of the case which involves multiple witnesses, we are working to securing a hearing date to encompass the availability of not just panellists and legal assessors but all case parties, their representatives, and multiple witnesses.


