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Background

- 1. The Business Plan 2015-16 provides that we will 'Undertake activities to ensure the quality of the education quality assurance process including: annual training and appraisal of all Visitors undertaking a quality assurance process and ongoing communications.'
- 2. This paper provides a brief update about the Education Visitor training planned for Friday 4 March 2016 and delivered jointly by the Quality Assurance Agency for Higher Education (QAA) and the General Osteopathic Council.

Discussion

- 3. Visitor training is an important opportunity for us to reinforce the key aspects of the review methods as well as the skills needed to undertake a successful review.
- 4. Almost all of the experienced Visitor pool will be attending the training session, long with the two GOsC Review QAA Co-ordinators and two co-opted Visitors for one Visit team. The training will be led by Dr David Gale of the Quality Assurance Agency and Tim Walker, Chief Executive of the General Osteopathic Council.
- 5. The aims of the programme are to:
 - Refresh understanding of the Standards and Outcomes feeding into the Quality Assurance methods (incorporating revision of the *Osteopathic Practice Standards*, the *Guidance for Osteopathic Pre-registration Education* and key aspects of the *Quality Code* including the revised *Subject Benchmark Statement: Osteopathy* (2015)
 - Refresh understanding of the review method (including definitions and triangulation of evidence)
 - To explore the role of the Visitor in the quality assurance process (including good practice, assessment and challenge)
 - To centralise the importance of patient and public safety in osteopathic education
 - Enhance understanding of equality and diversity issues
 - To explore how we can support the development of a community among the Education Visitors.
- 6. The programme will be delivered using a mix of presentations, interactive exercises, case studies and discussion and learning between experienced Visitors and new Visitors will be a part of the day.
- 7. Feedback from the training day will be reported to the Committee at its next meeting.
