
### Fitness to practise dashboard 1 October 2020 to 31 December 2020

#### **Case progression – at a glance**

- All PCC cases that had not commenced were postponed between 26 March and 3
  July 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Substantive hearings recommenced
  remotely in July 2020.
- The number of live cases older than 52 weeks remains at 11 cases as a consequence of the postponements.
- In this quarter the PCC sat remotely for 8 substantive hearings, reaching a final determination in six cases.
- In this quarter the HC did not review any cases.
- There are now 19 cases referred to the PCC and 11 are yet to be heard.
- The IC also met remotely on two occasions in this quarter. It considered 8 cases of which three were closed, three referred to the PCC and two were adjourned (linked case).
- There are 10 cases that have been referred to the IC by the screeners but not yet considered. This is in line with the IC caseload for the previous quarter.





#### **Key Performance Indicators**

- The screener KPI was not met for this guarter.
- The IC KPI was missed this quarter by two weeks. The fluctuation in quarterly data between this quarter and Q2 reflects the small size of the GOsC's caseload.
- The PCC KPI was missed by 13 weeks this quarter. This is due to the
  postponement of all substantive PCC hearings last quarter. This postponement is
  likely to continue to affect our performance against the PCC KPI in the next two
  quarters because we are listing the remaining affected cases for hearings in both
  Q4 of 2020-21 and Q1 of 2021-22.
- It is noted that the shortest case concluded by the PCC this quarter was 50 weeks, two weeks under the expected KPI.



 The IC considered and concluded 8 cases this quarter. Three were referred to the PCC, three were closed and the remaining two were adjourned.





#### **Professional Conduct Committee**

- In Q3 the PCC considered 8 cases and concluded six substantive cases.
- Two cases were adjourned. We have found that hearings conducted remotely take additional time to complete due to factors such as the impact of technical or internet connection issues and the need for more frequent breaks for participants. Initially, without prior experience of running remote hearings, it was challenging to accurately estimate how much additional time would be necessary. This is something we are now better able to estimate.


