Case progression – at a glance


- We have received 21 new concerns during the reporting period, an increase of 31% from the last guarter (16).
- The IC met remotely on three occasions and considered eight cases.
- During this reporting period the PCC met on seven occasions, reaching a final determination in five of the cases, with two cases going part heard.
- The output against the end to end KPI has increased, impacted by two part heard cases.
- There are currently 18 cases referred to the PCC by the IC. The breakdown of these cases are as follows: two have been scheduled for a hearing; in four cases we are actively seeking to list the hearing; three have been referred by the IC within this quarter and awaiting to be served in accordance with the standard case directions, three are progressing via the rule 8 procedure and therefore will not require a hearing and the remaining six cases await the outcome of a police investigation and/or trial before we can progress further.

Key Performance Indicators

- The Screener KPI was exceeded, at eight weeks.
- The Investigating Committee KPI was not met. A scheduled IC meeting had to be cancelled due to the last minute unavailability of the legal assessor. This has impacted the number of cases considered during the quarter as well as the output against the KPI at this stage.
- The output against the end-to-end target was not met. This was due to one hearing (since concluded) going part heard on two separate occasions due to a Committee member becoming ill last minute as well as being impacted by the registrant's unavailability. Another part heard case didn't resume for several months due to the unavailability of the same panel for the resuming hearing.



- The IC met remotely on three occasions and considered eight cases, of which two were no case to answer, five were referred to the PCC and another case referred to the Health Committee.
- There are currently 20 cases that have been referred to the IC by screeners but not yet considered. We have scheduled an IC meeting each month over the next calendar year but we have the flexibility to schedule additional IC meetings, as we have done previously, subject to IC panellist availability.





Professional Conduct Committee

- In the reporting period the PCC sat remotely for six substantive hearings and another was held in-person (seven in total), of which five of these hearings concluded and two went part heard.
- The PCC also sat on one PCC Interim Suspension Order hearing during the reporting period.

• As above, one PCC substantive hearing was held in-person and progressed efficiently, enabling the hearing to conclude on time. Our experience is that in-person hearings have benefits in terms of efficiency and timeliness. We continue to individually review cases awaiting PCC consideration to determine whether or not an 'in person', remote or 'hybrid' hearing would be appropriate, and the length of time required for adequate disposal of the case. We also take into consideration the stated preference of the complainant and the registrant (on the listings questionnaire). The relevant factors (non-exhaustive) may include: the likely hearing length and complexity; self-representation of the registrant; the type of case (health, breach of sexual boundaries; clinical; PII etc); the number of witnesses; the severity of the case and therefore potential seriousness of outcome; the stated preference of complainant and registrant; the health and /or mobility considerations of participants and appropriate / sufficient IT facilities.

Interim Suspension Orders

- There has been an increase in the number of Interim Suspension Order (ISO)
 applications over the reporting period, where there have been five applications.
 Three of these cases related to a transgression of sexual boundaries (two of
 which remain under police investigation), and two relate to the health of the
 registrant.
- IC Interim Suspension orders were imposed in two cases; no ISO was imposed in another two and in one case the registrant submitted an undertaking which was accepted by the Committee.
- There has also been one PCC Interim Order hearing, in which the suspension order was granted. This case related to a transgression of sexual boundaries.


