
Fitness to practise dashboard 1 April to 30 June 2020

Case progression – at a glance

- The number of concerns received has fallen by half compared to Q4 2019-20.
- The number of formal complaints referred to the IC by the screeners is broadly consistent with previous quarters.
- IC meetings are currently being held remotely due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The IC have considered 14 cases remotely this quarter, of which seven have been referred to the PCC and seven have been closed with no further action.
- The GOsC postponed all substantive, non-urgent hearings during this quarter due to the COVID-19 pandemic. There are currently 25 cases that have been referred to the PCC but not yet heard.
- As at the end of Q1, eight of the 25 PCC cases have been listed for remote or blended hearings in Q2 and Q3.
- There is one case part-heard as at the end of Q1. This is listed to resume as a remote hearing at the beginning of Q2.
- The overall caseload remains stable, with 40 formal cases open at the end of this quarter, compared with 41 at the end of the previous quarter.



New Referrals

- The number of concerns received was consistently high in all quarters in 2019-20. However, in this quarter the number of new concerns has decreased significantly and is comparable to 2018-19 numbers.
- The majority of concerns in Q1 related to COVID-19. These included concerns about comments made on social media about COVID-19 and concerns about poor infection control. Other concerns raised in this quarter related to ineffective or inappropriate treatment, a conviction for a driving offence, poor communication and the misuse of a protected title. There was one concern raised relating to sexual misconduct.

Key Performance Indicators

- Each KPI is the length of time, measured in median weeks, from receipt of concern to decision point (i.e. screener, IC or PCC/HC decision).
- As all substantive PCC cases have been postponed this quarter due to the COVID-19 outbreak, the KPI for PCC consideration is not included in this dataset.
- The target for IC decisions is 26 weeks. We met this target in Q1, achieving a median time of 21 weeks.
- The target for Screener decisions is 9 weeks. The median for Q1 was outside this target by one week. As a result of the fall in new concerns, older cases that had taken longer to process due to necessary pre-screen enquiries accounted for a disproportionate number of the cases screened in this quarter.






