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About the General Osteopathic Council

The General Osteopathic Council (GOsC) is the regulator for the osteopathic profession in the UK. Our role is to develop and regulate the profession of osteopathy which we do by setting standards of education, training, conduct and competence and keeping a Register of those who have qualified and met those standards. By law, osteopaths must be registered with us in order to practise in the UK; there are currently around 5,400 osteopaths.

Background

The Council of the General Osteopathic Council (GOsC) have a responsibility for setting the strategic direction of the organisation. Our current Strategic Plan ends on 31 March 2024.

Over the past 18 months, the Council has considered its strategic direction in a number of different ways. The approach has included: Council meeting discussions; Council Strategy Day events which included external speakers; online workshops; and commissioning and preparing a report which assessed our own performance as a regulator.

We feel we are now ready to consult on our next Strategic Plan, towards 2030.

The consultation

What is contained in the Strategic Plan, towards 2030

Headlines from the Draft GOsC Strategic Plan, towards 2030, are:

- Vision: To be an inclusive, innovative regulator trusted by all.
- Our priorities:

Strengthening Trust

We recognise that to regulate effectively and to ensure patient protection, we need to strengthen trust with our stakeholders. In order to achieve this, we plan to:

- Explore the relationship between the GOsC and osteopaths and how this may impact on trust, and on patient safety.
- Work in partnership with osteopaths, patients, educators and other stakeholders to model the values and behaviours expected of all healthcare professionals.
- Undertake and assess the results of osteopaths, stakeholders and public/patient surveys so we can measure the impact of our activities over a period time and take appropriate action.
- Ensure our regulatory approach is evidence-informed by bringing insight from the external environment into the GOsC and taking appropriate actions as a result.

Championing Inclusivity

There is strength in diversity and inclusivity and we wish to maximise this within our work over the coming years. In order to achieve this, we plan to:

- Hold ourselves accountable, actively demonstrating the behaviours we hope to see across the profession and to stakeholders in relation to living our agreed values.
- Analyse the impact of our equality monitoring data, and taking appropriate actions as a result, so we can be confident our processes and policies are inclusive and not discriminatory.
- Ensure our Governance structure, and our staff are diverse, inclusive and able to be their true selves, so that we are more representative of a wider society.
- Identify actions to ensure the GOsC Values are continually embedded across our regulatory approach and reporting publicly on how our Values have informed the decisions we take.

Embracing Innovation

We want to continually improve and be better in the future than we are today. We believe that embracing innovation is how we can achieve this, and therefore, we plan to:

- Support the development of osteopathic education to explore different and innovative ways it can meet the <u>Graduate Outcomes and Standards for</u> <u>Education and Training</u>.
- Seek new ways of ensuring the osteopath and patient voice remains at the heart of all we do.
- Commission research to enhance the development of our work in education and training, standards and fitness to practise.
- Develop a strategy and action plan to become an Environmentally Social Responsible organisation and employer.
