Item 6: Acting Chief Executive and Registrar's Report	Para 13b refers	Council would be provided with an update on a planned meeting with Office for Students, which at their request, had been postponed.	Completed. See Item 6, Acting Chief Executive and Registrar's Report, May 2020 agenda.
Item 6: Acting Chief Executive and Registrar's Report	Para 13c (ii) refers	A joint communication between the GOsC and the Care Quality Commission (CQC) on frenulotomy services was being developed.	Ongoing. A final draft of the communication is with CQC; however, this has been delayed due to the COVID-19 situation.
Item 7: Fitness to Practise Report	Para 20b refers	To check the number of PCC suspensions in Q3 and to understand the reasons for the suspensions.	Completed. We reported to Council in January 2020 that we believed the increase in PCC suspensions was due to Professional Indemnity Insurance cases. We have checked the data, and this is correct.
