1. Overview

The Patient Involvement Forum is a voluntary group made up of osteopathic patients and members of the public who have an interest in osteopathic practice, that provides the General Osteopathic Council with meaningful feedback on our work.

Our values

- Collaborative: We work with our stakeholders to ensure patients and osteopaths are at the centre of our approach to regulation.
- Influential: We seek to support and develop those we work with to enhance public protection.
- Respectful: We seek to hear, understand and consider the views of the people with whom we engage.
- Evidence-informed: We use a range of evidence to guide our work to ensure the best outcomes for patients and the public.

2. What Forum members can expect from us

We will:

- treat everyone **fairly, inclusively and with dignity and respect**
- respond to individual needs and make reasonable adjustments
- assign a dedicated Lead Contact or Lead Contacts to answer any questions before, during or after any participation activity
- set out the relevant information in advance of any activity
- reimburse reasonable expenses (for further information see Payment and Expenses policy)
- respect privacy, including keeping private information confidential (For more information read our [Privacy Policy](#))

- give us open, honest and constructive feedback about our work
- behave respectfully towards other Forum members, all staff and external stakeholders even when their views differ from their own
- respect confidentiality
- do not bring the GOsC into disrepute
