## **Provision of a Character Reference**

The Osteopaths Act 1993 requires that an applicant for registration under the Act must satisfy the Registrar that he/she is of good character before he/she can be registered to practise osteopathy. A reference as to the applicant's character is to be provided on this form by a person of professional standing in the community and includes a registered osteopath, a solicitor, accountant, bank manager, Justice of the Peace, Minister of the Church, Rabbi, Imam or other religious official acceptable to the Registrar, who is not a relative (either directly, or related by marriage which includes partners) and who has known the applicant for at least **four** years.

The Registrar may make further inquiries of the applicant and/or referees directly if it is deemed necessary to verify or clarify any part of this reference.
