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Background

- 4. Strategic Objective 2.6 of the GOsC Corporate Plan requires the GOsC to review the quality assurance of education and training and ensure that the procedures are fit for purpose.
- 5. Following consultation and development in conjunction with both the Quality Assurance Agency for Higher Education (QAA) and the Osteopathic Educational Institutions (OEIs), Council agreed to consult on a revised GOsC Review Method Handbook and Annual Report template.
- 6. The consultation took place between 19 February and 18 May 2011. The Consultation process is outlined in the attached report from the QAA at Annex A, together with the results of the consultation.
- 7. The QAA and GOsC targeted the following groups for feedback:
 - a. Osteopathic Educational Institutions
 - b. Post-graduate Educational Institutions
 - c. Osteopathy students
 - d. British Osteopathic Association
 - e. Other healthcare regulators
 - f. Department of Health / Council for Healthcare Regulatory Excellence
 - g. Patients
 - h. Public
 - i. QAA assessors
- 8. The Report will be published by the QAA and available on the GOsC website to ensure transparency with the consultation process.

Discussion

- 9. From the feedback, you will see that the changes to both the GOsC Review Method Handbook and the Annual Report template were generally met with approval in terms of the content, language and format and clarity.
- 10. There were however a number of areas where suggestions were made for improvements.

- These have been extracted from the QAA report and presented in a table at Annex B. The table also presents the views of the QAA, a discussion of the points raised and a suggested action.
- 12. The Education Committee is asked to review and agree the action to be taken for each point which will then be completed outside of Committee. Where amendments are to be made to the text of either the GOsC Review Method Handbook or the Annual Report template, these will be redrafted in conjunction with the QAA.
