


Journal articles and copyright

Osteopaths have access to articles from the *International Journal of Osteopathic Medicine* and other Elsevier journals through the o zone at

https://www.osteopathy.org.uk/ozone/resources/research/research-journals/. This access allows you to read journals and articles. If you wish to share an article you are not allowed to put the whole article itself on your practice website or email a pdf of the article to others without specific permission from the publisher. You can put a reference to the article on your website or in an email so that others can find and read the article themselves.

To get permission to reproduce an article you can use Rightslink. In the abstract or full-text view of the article there is an Article Tools menu, which includes a link to Rights/permissions. Clicking on that link takes you to the Rightslink service through which you can request permission to reproduce the article. There is a charge if permission is granted by Elsevier.



You may reproduce or email the article abstract to others and there is a link that enables you to email the abstract in the Article Tools menu.

If you are the author of the article the position is slightly different. Elsevier have a section about authors' rights in connection with articles they publish at http://www.elsevier.com/author-rights-and-responsibilities.

If you wish to reproduce articles in journals produced by other publishers you would need to contact those publishers about permission.
