

GOsC updated statement about face to face osteopathic practice (4 January 2021)

This statement is subject to change so please keep checking for updates. See the version history for this document.

There is not a prohibition on osteopathic practice in the current legislation across the UK.

We continue to advise osteopaths to use their professional judgement in determining whether it is appropriate to see patients for face-to-face treatment. Other options for treatment include phone or video consultations.

If osteopaths consider, in discussion with the patient, that it is appropriate to offer a face-to-face consultation as a treatment option, they should:

- Triage patients remotely prior to attendance to ensure that they and
 members of their household do not have relevant symptoms and that they
 are not subject to requirements to self-isolate. Consider, with the patient,
 whether a video or phone consultation may be an appropriate treatment
 option. See also our 'Statement on remote consultations' and 'A guide to
 telephone and remote consultations' published by the Institute of
 Osteopathy.
- In making decisions with patients, osteopaths should consider the needs of their patients to receive treatment against the risks posed by undertaking that treatment both to the patient, themselves, and the public, in the current context of transmission of COVID-19.
- Ensure that stringent infection control procedures are in place where they are practising and that there are policies in place to reduce the transmission of any diseases. Osteopaths must review relevant guidance from the relevant public health bodies and governments for the area in which they are working, and ensure that what they do continues to reflect any updated guidance. See also our interim infection control guidance, and the range of resources and guidance published by the Institute of Osteopathy (the professional membership body for osteopaths).

In the current emergency context of COVID-19, all osteopaths who are practising must ensure that they protect their patients and the public, themselves and others, and should ensure that they have read and implemented as appropriate, updated guidance to the country in which they are practising including:

- Relevant clinical guidance for the local area in which the osteopath is practising including: <u>COVID-19</u>: <u>guidance for health professionals</u> (England) (24 December 2020); <u>Guidance for Primary Care</u> (Scotland) (17 September 2020), <u>Guidance for Health and Social Care Staff, healthcare workers and providers</u> (Northern Ireland) and <u>Guidance for Health and Social Care professionals</u>: coronavirus (Wales).
- Other related guidance: <u>Coronavirus Guidance (England)</u>, <u>Coronavirus Guidance (Scotland)</u>, <u>Coronavirus Guidance (Northern Ireland)</u>, <u>Coronavirus Guidance (Wales)</u>
