We have designed a survey for all osteopaths on the GOsC register to complete. The GOsC will not have access to raw data, which will only be seen by members of the research team. Results will be reported anonymously, so that no individual can be identified from their response, in a report to the GOsC towards the end of 2014, which will then be made publicly available. The academic team also plan to subsequently produce and publish academic articles using these data.

For most survey questions all you need to do is read the statement, decide how much you agree or disagree with it, and then tick the box that shows how much you agree.
